Gospel Summary

help his listeners understand the interconnectedness and relationships between God the Father, Jesus, and all followers of Jesus. Jesus is the vine and we, the followers, are the branches that grow from that vine. The way we glorify God is by bearing much fruit and by becoming disciples of Jesus.

Reflection for Parents

Today's Gospel invites you to consider what you are doing in your domestic Church, the Church of your home, to remain connected to the vine (Jesus) and to the vine grower (God the Father). Have any attitudes, behaviors, choices, or practices crept into **9:00am** family life and weakened or broken your connection to Jesus, the vine? If so, what can you do to re-establish or strengthen the connection?

Bringing the Gospel Into Your Family

Bring your "Reflection for Parents" into a family discussion of what you are doing to remain strong in your connection to the vine (Jesus) and to the vine grower (God the Father). Then talk about things that are happening that could potentially weaken your connection to Jesus, the vine. For example, the Sunday sports schedule is taking precedence over attending Sunday Mass and religious education classes. Or, the busy pace of weeknights has crowded out time for family prayer at the end of the day. Make a plan to re-energize your connection to the vine, and work together to accomplish the plan!

Discussion Starters

Use today's discussion time to take a walk together. Notice new growth on the trees and bushes, and pause in your walk to name ways you are growing in faith and bearing good fruit. Continue walking, and point out any dead branches Thursday, May 2 or leaves that have fallen away from the trees. Pause to quietly pray for forgiveness for any ways in which you have turned away from Jesus, the vine.







From our Pastor's Desk...



In this week's pastor's corner, I want to bring your attention to the ongoing celebration of the Year of Prayer. It is a time for us to reflect on the importance of both personal and communal prayer in our everyday lives. As stated by the Holy Father, the Year of Prayer 2024 is devoted to "rediscovering the immense significance and essential requirement of prayer - prayer in our personal lives, within the Church, and throughout the world."

Additionally, this year is also a time of preparation for the upcoming Year of Jubilee in 2025. Similar to previous Jubilees, the Holy See will organize global initiatives, and there will be various special events and local initiatives in the Archdiocese of Toronto. To help with the preparation and execution of the 2025 Jubilee Year, Father Tim Hanley, who currently serves as the pastor at St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish in Mississauga, will act as the coordinator. Father Hanley will establish a small committee, and more details will be provided regarding our own plans to commemorate this occasion in the Archdiocese of Toronto.

A mini-site has been developed at www.archtoronto.org. The archdiocese will add resources and information as they become available. Regular video reflections on the seven petitions of the Lord's Prayer will be produced. The Year of Prayer and Jubilee Year offer a chance to intensify personal and community prayer. This will help Jesus be present in our hearts.



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION In today's Gospel we are invited to reflect on the image of Jesus, the true vine. Jesus says "Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me." As stewards, there is much to be gleaned through reflecting on this passage. Firstly, Jesus desires to abide in us. He does this whenever we receive Him in the Eucharist. In the same way, we are called to abide in Him by prayerfully placing our very selves in His presence, whether it's through praying in our rooms or before the Blessed Sacrament. This close relationship with Jesus is where our stewardship originates and is sustained. Jesus bluntly proclaims that we can do nothing without abiding in Him first. As stewards, more than the actual works we perform, we are giving other people Christ through our time and talents. We can only give what we have first received. Therefore, it is of paramount importance that we focus on our prayer life above all. For example, before we plan on giving our time to a fellow parishioner and journeying with them, let us say a prayer asking God for the strength to work through us. Similarly, before we offer up our talents through various ministries in the parish, we should try to say a prayer asking that our works may point others to Christ, not to ourselves. Therefore, through abiding in Christ we may share His love and presence with others.

In today's Gospel Jesus says "Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me." We can abide in Jesus by placing ourselves in His presence whenever we pray and He likewise abides in us, especially through receiving Him in the Eucharist. This close relationship with Jesus is where our stewardship originates and is sustained so let us never fail to go to Him before we offer up our time and talents to the parish
