Pastor's thoughts ...

Today's gospel begins with a list of big-shots: the Emperor Tiberius; the governor Pontius Pilate; Herod, ruler of Galilee and his brother Philip, the other tetrarch; Lysanias ruler of Abilene; and even the supreme religious leaders of Israel, Annas and Caiaphas. It was a way of helping us pinpoint with a certain precision when a certain event happened. Obviously, the writer (St Luke) deemed this event so important that it merited precise detail. Following this star-studded introduction, Luke tells us what the event was: the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. What an anti-climax! The person: John. A nobody in the upper circles of society, a religious extremist who had a knack for getting himself in trouble. The place: in the desert. Far from the glorious palaces of the political leaders mentioned, and even far from the temple, home of two high-priests.

The word of God came to John. Again, a very precise detail. In a world full of words, it was one specific word John received – God's word. This is very fitting as we enter into the second week of Advent. This season will eventually lead us to the celebration of Christmas, when the Word of God becomes flesh. And then, throughout the whole year, we shall see this Word of God in action. In the gospel Jesus does not speak to us about love; he loves. He does not speak to us about mercy, or of giving – he shows mercy and he gives himself to others. This word which came to John is alive and active!

It is this Word that we are being invited to receive this Christmas, and beyond. Advent helps us to prepare the ground for its reception. We have to straighten our paths so that we can be able to see clearly. Distractions have to be cleared away. The Word will help us to fill our emptiness, the voids in our lives, so that we can truly live a full life. The first reading from the prophet Baruch develops this theme very well. It is an invitation to arise at the sound of God's word, "rejoicing that God has remembered" us. It is, in actual fact a song of returning. After seventy years in exile, the people of God is now returning to Jerusalem, to where he really belongs. The mission of John the Baptist will eventually become a constant call for conversion. He invites Herod for conversion, and he invites each and every one of us to do the same. The true meaning of conversion is to return to the right place, to where you belong.

"God will lead Israel with joy, in the light of his glory," proclaims Baruch. Indeed, the season of Advent is a joyous

journey leading us to the one true light for whom the angels sang "Glory" on Christmas night. It is the light that has to guide us in our lives. "Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path," prays the psalmist. It is all connected. The Word which took flesh in Bethlehem is the word which enlightens our path. Thanks to this light, we can look forward to celebrate a merry and joyous Christmas.
