Pastor's thoughts ...



It was a Saturday evening many years ago, and I was out for a walk having finished my church-duties for the day. On the way I met three of our young parishioners, three girls in their teens, well dressed up obviously for a night out with some friends. In our small conversation they remarked that they had nothing in particular in mind. They were just going for a walk along the esplanade (it was a cool, summer evening) "to see and to be seen". As I continued on my walk, I thought of how important it is for young people to be "seen" and to be acknowledged as they grow through so many uncertainties and develop their securities.

This episode came to my mind as I was reading today's gospel. Jesus, now in Jerusalem, was in the temple and must have been observing the many comings and goings of all the different kinds of people. The Passover (Easter) was close, and the place must have been busier than usual. He could not help but notice how the scribes made it so obvious that they liked to be seen. Probably there was nothing wrong with that, just some teen -age like immaturity. The problem with these people was that they would do anything to feed their delusion of grandeur. According to Jesus, they would even "devour widows' houses", just to feel important. Now we know that widows and orphans were special in God's eyes, because they were the most vulnerable people of society in those times. Jesus had strong words for these scribes, probably the only time in the gospel where He uttered condemnation.

Through His keen eyes Jesus saw another detail which many probably would have missed. There was a poor widow who gave as an offering to the temple "two small copper coins". She was one of many in the crowd, probably invisible and anonymous for almost everyone there ... except for Jesus, of course! Jesus noticed her gesture, and praised what she did. He told his friends that, in spite of the small amount she gave, she had in fact given her everything, all that she had. And this she did in silence, without being noticed.

This woman of the gospel reminds me of the many people we have in our parishes who give of their time, their

energy (whatever is left!), and their resources without much fanfare. No name-engraving on brass plaques, no expectations of a public thank-you, just silent, hidden gestures often known only to God.

Often what really matters in life is not what we do, but why and how we do it. The widow of the gospel gave much less than most other people, but it was her that Jesus praised. In a way, she becomes a model of Jesus' disciple who is expected to forego everything to follow Him. When, recalling last week's gospel, we put God as the number one in our lives and manage to love Him above all else with our whole being, then we would not need to seek other people's approval and glory.

As St Theresa would say in her wisdom, "Whoever has God lacks nothing; God alone suffices."
