Pastor's thoughts ...



A first reading of today's gospel can give us the impression that Jesus is talking about the end of the world. After all, this passage does fall under what we call "apocalyptic" literature. It is a term coming from the Greek verb "apokalýptein", which means to take the cover off, or to reveal. However, Jesus made it clear that his concern at that particular moment was not the end of the world. "About that day or hour no one knows, neither the Angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father," He told His listeners.

The people to whom Mark wrote this gospel were going through hard times. In Rome Nero was mercilessly persecuting the Christians, from the great fire of Rome in the year 64 onwards. The First Jewish-Roman War was on (66-73 AD), culminating in the


destruction of Jerusalem and its temple in the year 70 AD. Tensions were also growing between different factions within the young Church itself. It was a time of crisis, and people were justifiably asking "where are we heading?" Many in Mark's community would have been wondering if the end times were in fact quite near. In moments like this, apocalyptic literature was often used, to reveal God's presence and action in such crisis. To the people, this gave hope. Its essential message was an assurance that God's beautiful designs will be fulfilled, despite all appearances to the contrary.

In the gospel Jesus speaks about the sun that will be darkened, and the stars falling. Mark's readers immediately knew that Jesus was referring to the many gods worshipped by the people surrounding and persecuting them. Besides, Caesar himself was worshipped as a god. Jesus is saying that the end of these idols will eventually come, and "then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in clouds' with great power and glory." The message of Christ's resurrection, His victory over death and all that is evil, could not be forgotten! The reference to the blooming fig tree is also significant. In spite of everything, the young Christian community, still in its infancy, will eventually grow and produce fruit, fruit that is as sweet as the fig.

Sometimes we might find ourselves in the same situation as that of Mark's community. How often have I heard people wondering "where are we heading?" or lamenting that the world, or the Church, is not what it used to be! Jesus' message is a message of hope, not of pessimism. Without denying the reality and existence of evil (after all,

Jesus was really murdered) His resurrection tells us that evil does not have the last word.

As I reflect on today's message, the great English mystic Julian of Norwich comes to mind. During her lifetime Julian experienced, among other things, the Black Death and the Peasants' Revolt (which affected most of England in 1381). Besides, when she was 30, she became so seriously ill that she thought she was on her deathbed. She lived to be at least 73 years old. In one of her writings Julian says, "If there is anywhere on earth a lover of God who is always kept safe, I know nothing of it, for it was not shown to me. But this was shown: that in falling and rising again we are always kept in that same precious love." And this is what really matters.


SUNDAY MISSAL - 2022
