

January 9, 2022 The Baptism of the Lord - C

Pastor's thoughts ...



After his baptism Jesus was praying, and the voice from heaven declared: "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

Unlike the other evangelists, St Luke is not utterly concerned with what happened during the baptism of Jesus. Rather, his focus is on what happened afterwards. Luke wrote his gospel to people who, like you and me, were already baptized. In today's passage he is telling us: look, this is what happened to Jesus after his baptism. As a baptized Christian, this is your life.

The picture painted by Luke is one of a beautiful relationship between Father and Son. The Son immediately enters into communion with the Father through prayer. The heavens open: there is no more distance between God and man. After all, Jesus' coming into our world is the physical expression of Immanuel – "God is with us". The Father, then, publicly recognizes the baptized one as his Son, a son who is loved and who gives pleasure to the Father.

Following the celebrations of Christmas, today we begin what is liturgically called the "ordinary time". This is an important time, because it is in the ordinariness of our everyday life that we are called to live out our baptism as Christians. The story of what happened at the baptism of Jesus sets the tone for us for this coming year.

Heaven is opened, implying that God is now not distant anymore. Jesus is truly the Emmanuel, the God -is-with-us;

The Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus. In the beginning of Jesus' ministry Luke will highlight how Jesus was constantly moved by this Spirit. It is this Spirit, He says, that sent him to bring good news, to bring freedom, and give light to those who are in darkness;

God's voice proclaims Jesus as the Beloved Son, in whom he is well-pleased.

All this happens, of course, in a context of prayer.

The same dynamics that were present at Jesus' baptism are present in our own baptism.

The one-ness between us and God, which had been destroyed by Adam's sin, is restored. The same Spirit that descended upon Jesus is given to us too, to guide us and move us in our mission. And, like Jesus, we are proclaimed sons and daughters of God, in whom He is well-pleased. Nothing can change this reality. Irrespective of what we do in life, we remain children who are loved by the Father.

For those who doubt this fact, Luke will eventually gift us with the story of the prodigal son. But that's a story for another day. - Fr Mario

- Mass times remain the same, and our church capacity is unchanged since we do not reach 50% of capacity as we maintain physical distance between households.
- We continue to encourage everyone to get vaccinated if you haven't already, and get the booster if you have.
- Please do not congregate in groups outside the church before or after Mass.
