

## Pastor's thoughts ...



In the Bible we have two books which were written by St Luke: the Gospel and the "Acts of the Apostles". The first one tells us about the life of Jesus and his message, while in the latter we have an account of how the first community of believers lived this message. Both books are addressed to a certain Theophilus, a name which means "lover of God". We can say, therefore that these are written for you and I since all of us are people who love God. Interestingly, the story of the ascension of Jesus into heaven (today's celebration) is the link which connects both books - it concludes the Gospel and opens the second book ... and both have a common message.

Both Ascension narratives of Luke (the one in the Acts of the Apostles and in the other one in his Gospel), come with a mission. The disciple of Jesus is not supposed to stay

there, "standing, looking into the sky". He is, rather, to be a "witness" of Jesus, sharing with others all that Jesus is and stands for. In particular, he is to preach "repentance for the forgiveness of sins to all the nations". This had been, essentially, the mission of Jesus when he was on this earth. It is the possibility of a new life, free from sin - free, that is, from all that hinders us from being free enough to love God and neighbor.

Speaking about this feast-day, Pope Francis made a beautiful reflection:


"This feast contains two elements. On one hand, it directs our look to Heaven, where Jesus, glorified, is seated at the right hand of God. On the other, it recalls the beginning of the Church's mission: why? Because Jesus risen and

ascended into Heaven sends His disciples to spread the Gospel throughout the world; therefore, the Ascension exhorts us to raise our gaze to Heaven, to then turn it back immediately to earth, carrying out the tasks that the Risen Lord has entrusted to us."

Yes, I do have to look towards Heaven. Not in a nostalgic way akin to the look of someone looking at an airplane on which a loved one has just departed. But because I have to keep reminding myself that I constantly need Him to be able to fulfil my mission. That look, then, necessarily turns towards the world around me, wherever I happen to be. It is here that I now have to continue Jesus' mission. The need to be truly able to love both God and neighbor is seen and felt all around me.

Sharing in the mission of Jesus might seem a daunting task. A number of questions and doubts may come to mind. Am I worthy? Probably not. Have I got what it takes? On my own, definitely not! But unlike the case of a student trying to imitate his master, what makes it possible in my case is not simply the inspiration coming from what the master has already done. It is, rather, a power coming from the master himself. He has promised to give the Holy Spirit, the same Spirit He had. This is what is being promised today, and what we shall celebrate on Pentecost Sunday.

"A respected doctor, accustomed to treating the wounds of the soul, was once asked what the greatest need of human beings is. He replied: "The boundless desire to be heard". A desire that often remains hidden, but that challenges anyone who is called upon to be an educator or formator, or who otherwise performs a communicative role: parents and teachers, pastors and pastoral workers, communication professionals and others who carry out social or political service.

... In the Church, too, there is a great need to listen to and to hear one another. It is the most precious and lifegiving gift we can offer each other.

... A synodal process has just been launched. Let us pray that it will be a great opportunity to listen to one another.

Communion, in fact, is not the result of strategies and programmes, but is built in mutual listening between brothers and sisters."
