# Pastor's thoughts ...



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### "Go, set the world on fire."

St Ignatius of Lovola loved the missions. He would have loved to go to the missions himself, but since he was not allowed to due to health reasons, he personally sent some of his first members of his Order (the Jesuits) to the Far East. Amongst them was St Francis Xavier, a good friend of his, who was to eventually become one of the patron saints of the missions. It is said that, when St Ignatius sent this first group of missionaries, he told them "Go, set the world on fire". Ignatius also often used this phrase at the end of his letters to his missionaries.

I imagine that, in using this expression, St Ignatius was thinking of Jesus' words in today's Gospel: "I came to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already

kindled!" Another biblical image that comes to mind is the tongues of fire which descended on the apostles on Pentecost, giving them the power of the Holy Spirit. It is the fire which the Apostles were to take with them as they went throughout the world, obeying Jesus' command, to proclaim Jesus' Good News. It is also the fire which we receive, and which we pass on to our children on the day of baptism as we light our candle from the Easter Candle. Fire implies light, warmth, passion. It can also burn, destroy and purify.

As we journey with Jesus, being his disciples, we are invited to share in his mission of spreading this fire. So, the first question that comes to mind is: "Do I have the fire burning inside me?" Because, the simple truth is that, unless I have it, I cannot share it with others! We all have something we are very passionate about in our lives. So, a better question would be, "What kind of fire do I have burning inside me?"

The fire which Jesus brought to the world is the fire of Love. Everything he did was a living expression of this Love. He did not hesitate to say that Love is the greatest commandment of all the laws that the Jews had to adhere to. When he was about to leave this world, the instruction he gave to his disciples was simply to love one another as he had loved them.

Unfortunately, not everybody is willing or ready to accept the message of Jesus. Some people tend to put their own interests before anything else. This can cause divisions, as people who do not share the same values might not approve of some our decisions. How often have we been called stupid of old-fashioned for sticking to the values of Jesus Christ? Sometimes, these people can be our own friends or family members. Jesus spoke openly

about this, so that we will not be taken by surprise when such things happen in our lives.

As Christians, as followers of Jesus, all we have to do is to keep walking on the footsteps of our Master. Often, a small good action can have great effects. It is like a small spark, which can spread and become a huge fire. To share in the mission of Jesus we might not be asked to do great things. St Catherine of Siena reminds us: "Be who God meant you to be, and you will set the world on fire."

Monday, August 15, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Commonly known amongst the Maltese as Santa Marija, this celebration is very dear to Maltese Catholics.

This is also a very important day for the **Missionary Society of St Paul**, as Santa Marija is patroness of the Society. In 1933, Msgr Joseph DePiro wrote:

"We too chose her as our most cherished patroness, we who since the beginning of the Institute (the MSSP) felt Mary's help. Since the Institute had its beginning in the island of Saint Paul, we felt that we could not do better than venerate her under a very ancient custom in Malta when, under the title "Santa Marija" her assumption into heaven is celebrated throughout the whole place."

The Assumption was defined as dogma in the Catholic Church by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950, when he declared that "that he Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

**Prayer**: Father in heaven, all creation rightly gives you praise, for all life and all holiness come from you.

In the plan of your wisdom she who bore the Christ in her womb was raised body and soul in glory to be with him in heaven. May we follow her example in reflecting your holiness and join in her hymn of endless love and praise. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
