# Pastor's thoughts ...



"Most excellent Theophilus" ... my dear Lover of God. We do not know whether this Theophilus, to whom Luke is going to write this gospel, actually existed. We do know, however, that Theophilus means "lover of God". What St Luke is going to put on paper is written to you who love God.

I know, your life might not be an exact example of the perfect Christian. You have your weaknesses and have made your fair share of mistakes. All this does not take away the fact that you love God. It only says that you are not always able to express this love as you would probably like to do. And Luke is here to help you.

The word "gospel" literally means "good news", and this is what St Luke intends to impart. He knows that we go through down-times in our lives. We go through moments of difficulties or crises. We have moments when we are disheartened and tempted to give up. It is not a coincidence that Luke (who was also a doctor, by the way) puts today's gospel reading at the beginning of Jesus' ministry. It was on a Sabbath when Jesus goes to the synagogue of his home village. The reading from the prophet Isaiah which he chooses is actually speaking about himself, he tells the people. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me," he reads, which reminds us of the Holy Spirit which appeared upon him not long ago at his baptism. He is "anointed" to bring good news to the poor, to bring freedom to those who lack it, to bring light to those who need it. In a very significant gesture, Jesus closes the book and puts it away after reading that passage. "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing," he tells those around him. From now on, he is going to be the living Word of God for us.

Throughout history God has never abandoned those who love Him. In the Old Testament He sent prophets, like

Ezra in today's first reading, to encourage and give hope to His people when they were discouraged. For the people, listening to Ezra's words was not like simply hearing someone tell a story. It was a living experience of true listening which made them cry and then rejoice. It was something that touched their hearts and transformed their lives. This is what happens to anyone who truly listens to God's Word. St Paul is a typical example of this reality. During this week we shall be celebrating the day when he heard God's voice on the road to Damascus. There, Paul listened. "What do you want me to do, Lord," he asked while he was still on the ground. Through that act of listening Paul allowed God's Word to transform his life. From then on, he became a bearer of good news to the whole world.

Sometimes people think that faith or religion simply means having to obey a certain number of rules and commandments. The truth is that true faith implies listening to God's Word, which is a word of love and mercy, and allow oneself to be transformed by it, just like St Paul.
