

From our Pastor's Desk...



I am writing to invite you to join a new prayer group in our parish dedicated to St. Therese of Lisieux, also known as the Little Flower of Jesus. She was a Carmelite nun who lived a simple and humble life of love and trust in God. She died at 24 from tuberculosis but left behind a beautiful spiritual legacy that has inspired millions of people around the world. She was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1925 and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II in 1997..

St. Therese is a patron saint of missions and of florists, but she is also a powerful intercessor for all our needs and intentions. She once said, "I want to spend my

heaven in doing good on earth." She promised to shower roses from heaven as a sign of her prayers and favors. The Church has attributed many miracles to her intercession, especially through the use of her relics.

The jubilee year of St. Therese of Lisieux started on January 8, 2023. On that day, the Holy Doors of the Basilicas of Lisieux and Alençon were opened together. The jubilee year will end on January 8, 2024, when the Holy Doors will be closed. It is a special year in the Catholic Church where believers can receive a plenary indulgence by fulfilling certain conditions. These conditions include visiting the shrines of St. Therese, performing works of mercy, and receiving the sacraments of reconciliation and Eucharist.

The spiritual meaning of the jubilee year is to rediscover God's infinite mercy. It is a time to recognize that God welcomes everyone and personally seeks to connect with each individual. Additionally, it is an opportunity to follow the example of St. Therese and embrace the "little way" of spiritual childhood. This path is based on trust and surrendering to God's love.

The prayer group's purpose is to learn about St. Therese's life and spirituality. We aim to follow her example of holiness in our daily lives and to pray for ourselves and others, having confidence in her intercession. We will also share our experiences of her presence and help in our lives, and thank her for the roses she sends us.

The first meeting of this prayer group will be on Monday, November 6th at 10 am in the parish hall. Please join us after the 9:15 am Mass for a coffee and then come together to pray and to present your prayer intentions. We will read some excerpts from her writings.

I hope you will join me in this new initiative to honour and imitate St. Therese, the Little Flower of Jesus. She is a friend and a sister to us all, and she wants to help us grow closer to God and to each other.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION This weekend the entire church celebrates World Mission Sunday in which we renew our missionary commitment to the Gospel. Pope Francis said that "the mission of the Christian in the world is a mission for all, a mission of service, which excludes no-one; it requires great generosity and in particular the gaze and heart turned heavenward to invoke the Lord's help." The Holy Father exhorts all of us to see ourselves as missionaries. In today's first reading, the Lord says to us "I call you by your name." This invitation to be a missionary is deeply personal. All of us are called by the Lord to serve him with our whole lives and help spread the Gospel to those around us. One way we can live out this missionary call is by being faithful to our call of stewardship. In today's Gospel, Jesus says to give "God the things that are God's." Is not our entire life God's? He is the one who created us and blessed us with countless gifts which are all owed back to him. Cardinal Collins says in his Pastoral Letter on Stewardship* that "A steward is a servant entrusted for a time with the goods of the Master. The steward uses but does not own these goods and must eventually give an account to the Master." Let us seek to give of ourselves to our parish community to live out our missionary call of stewardship.
