

From our Pastor's Desk...



As we enter the month of November, we are invited to reflect on the mystery of the communion of saints and our responsibility to pray for the souls in purgatory. On November 1st, we celebrated the solemnity of All Saints, honouring all those who have reached the glory of heaven and who intercede for us before God. On November 2nd, we will commemorate All Souls' Day, remembering all those who have died in God's grace and who are still undergoing purification in purgatory.

The Church teaches us that we can help the souls in purgatory by offering prayers, sacrifices, and almsgiving on their behalf. One of the most powerful ways to do this is

by gaining indulgences for them. An indulgence is a remission of the temporal punishment due to sin, which has already been forgiven in confession. The Church grants indulgences by applying the merits of Christ and the saints to those who fulfill certain conditions. There are two kinds of indulgences: plenary and partial. A plenary indulgence removes all the temporal punishment due to sin, while a partial indulgence removes only part of it.

To gain a plenary indulgence, one must perform a prescribed work (such as visiting a cemetery or a church), go to confession, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Pope, and be free from any attachment to sin. Only one plenary indulgence can be gained per day, and it can be applied to oneself or to a deceased person. A partial indulgence can be gained by performing any good work with a contrite heart, or by reciting certain prayers (such as the Eternal Rest or the Requiem Aeternam). A partial indulgence can be applied to oneself or to a deceased person as many times as one wishes.

I encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity to show your love and mercy to the souls in purgatory, especially during this month dedicated to them.

I also invite you to join me for our first group meeting on Monday, November 6th, at 10:00 AM in the St. Joseph's room. (Coffee and pastries will be served following the 9: 15 am Mass) We will be learning more about St. Therese of Lisieux, one of the most popular and influential saints of modern times. St. Therese was a Carmelite nun who died at the age of 24 from tuberculosis. She is known as the Little Flower of Jesus because she practiced a simple and humble way of holiness that she called "the little way". She taught that we can please God and become saints by doing small things with great love, such as offering our daily duties, joys, and sufferings to Him. She also had a great devotion to the Child Jesus and the Holy Face of Jesus, and she offered herself as a victim of love for the salvation of souls. She is the patroness of missionaries, France, Russia, those suffering from HIV/AIDS or tuberculosis, florists and gardeners, orphaned children, those who are homeless, and aviators.

St. Therese is also famous for her promise to spend her heaven doing good on earth and to shower roses upon those who ask for her intercession. She said: "After my death I will let fall a shower of roses. I will spend my heaven in doing good upon earth." Many people have experienced her powerful intercession and have received roses as signs of her presence and love.

I hope to see you at our group meeting, and I pray that St. Therese will inspire us all to follow her little way of holiness.

Moreover, the saints provide us an example of how to run the race as well. The saints always utilized the gifts that God gave them to serve Christ and His Church. They each did this in their own unique way dependent on their particular gifts and vocation. We too as stewards should follow their example and use our particular gifts to help us run the race well. St. Bernard also says that "we must above all seek the prayers of the saints. Thus, what is beyond our own powers to obtain will be granted through their intercession." Therefore let us seek the intercession of the saints and look to follow their example in order to deepen our resolve of being good stewards of Christ. The saints always utilized the gifts that God gave them to serve Christ and His Church in their own unique way dependant on their particular gifts.
