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

13TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Gospel Summary

Today's Gospel reading contains two stories that feature the healing ministry of Jesus. In the first story Jairus falls at Jesus' feet and begs Jesus to go and lay hands on his daughter, who is at the point of death. In the second story the woman who had been long afflicted with a hemorrhage touches Jesus' cloak, saying, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured" (Mark 5:28).

To the woman Jesus says, "Daughter, your faith has saved you" (Mark 5:34). To Jairus Jesus says, "Do not be afraid; just have faith" (Mark 5:36).

Reflection for Parents

Parents and caregivers can understand Jairus's desperation in seeking out Jesus. Who wouldn't try everything possible to save his or her child? Today's Gospel reminds us that we need God's help. We must stay strong in faith and continue to trust in God's plan for us and for our children.

Bringing the Good News Into Your Family

As a family, make a list of those you know who are sick and in need of healing. Put the list on your family prayer table or post it on your refrigerator. Encourage all family members to pray for those on the list each and every day. As an alternative, bring the list to the dinner table each night and begin your meal by praying for those on the list. Also take time to create and send a Get Well card or note of encouragement to each person on the list.

The **RCIA** stands for the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.** It's a program within the Catholic Church that helps individuals who A JOURNEY IN FAITH are interested in becoming Catholic.

Here are the key points about RCIA:

Purpose:

RCIA informs those who wish to be confirmed what it means to be a member of the Body of Christ—the Catholic Church established by Christ Jesus.

PARTICIPANTS:

Catechumens: These are unbaptized individuals. **Candidates for full communion**: These are people baptized in another Christian denomination. Both groups undergo an educational process through RCIA.

PROCESS:

RCIA involves several stages marked by study, prayer and rites at Mass.

It gradually prepares participants for full initiation into the Catholic Church.

The goal is to deepen their understanding of the faith and prepare them for the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist).
