PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Gospel Summary

In today's Gospel we read that Mary and Joseph honored God's law by taking Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem in order to present him to the Lord. There we encounter Simeon, a man of great faith who believed in God's promise that he would see the Christ of the Lord before he died. We are also introduced to the prophetess Anna, who worshiped in the Temple day and night. Following the presentation, the Holy Family returned to Nazareth in Galilee, where Jesus grew and became strong...

Reflection for Parents

As parents we can appreciate the way that Mary and Joseph honored God's law by presenting Jesus in the Temple. Most of us have presented our own children for Baptism in our own parish churches. These are important events in the journey of faith. But the very end of today's Gospel, which speaks of the return to Nazareth where the child Jesus continued to grow, reminds us that it is in the days after and in-between such events that faith is lived out, learned, and strengthened in daily family life. What we say and do in the ordinary moments of ordinary days together helps shape who our children will become.

Bringing the Gospel into Your Family

Recall Simeon and Anna, two elderly people of faith who are introduced in today's Gospel passage. Help your children recall the elderly members of your family and their ancestors who kept the faith throughout the ages. Show your children pictures of these faithful women and men, and share what you know about them. If you have kept a family tree in your Bible, review it with your children. As an alternative, create together a family tree that allows space for drawings, photographs, short stories, and the names of your ancestors in faith. Place this family tree in a place where all family members can see it and add to it.

Discussion Starters

In place of discussion starters today, invite your family to take part in the following suggested prayer and action.

- 1. **Prayer:** Make a list of all of the elderly members of your family and their ancestors whose names were mentioned today. Read the names one at a time, inviting family members to respond, "Pray for us."
- 2. **Action:** As a family, think about an elderly family member, neighbor, or friend in need of special help or care. Decide on an action you can take as a family to help the person who comes to mind. Make a plan to take action within the next week.

As we journey through the liturgical year, February brings us two significant celebrations: the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd and the Memorial of St. Blaise on February 3rd.

The Presentation of the Lord On February 2nd, we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord, also known as Candlemas Day. This feast commemorates the presentation of Jesus in the Temple by Mary and Joseph, in accordance with Jewish law. It marks the moment when Simeon and Anna recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah, the Light to the nations. This celebration highlights the importance of Jesus' presence as a light in our lives and calls us to reflect on our own call to be light for others. Traditionally, candles are blessed on this day, symbolizing Christ as the Light of the World.

The Memorial of St. Blaise On February 3rd, we remember St. Blaise, a 4th-century bishop and martyr known for his miraculous healings, particularly of throat ailments. Following the homily during the 9:15 am Mass, we will have the blessing of throats, invoking St. Blaise's intercession for protection from illnesses. This tradition is a beautiful reminder of God's care for us and the intercessory power of the saints.

Jubilee Year Celebrations We invite all parishioners to join us in celebrating the Opening Jubilee Year Masses in the Central Region of the Archdiocese of Toronto. The Masses will be held at:

- St. Paul's Basilica (83 Power Street) on Wednesday, February 12th, celebrated by Bishop Kasun
- St. Mary's Church (588 Adelaide Street) on Thursday, February 20th, celebrated by Bishop Kasun
- **St. Edward the Confessor Church (75 Churchill Ave)** on Tuesday, February 25th, celebrated by Cardinal Francis Leo

All Masses will begin at 7:00 pm, with confession times from 5:30 pm to 6:45 pm. This is a wonderful opportunity to come together as a community and reflect on the blessings of our faith.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. We reflect on Joseph and Mary taking the child Jesus up to the temple and the prophet Simeon taking the child into his arms. Simeon was an elderly prophet in Jerusalem to whom it had been revealed that "he would not see death before he had seen the Christ" (Luke 2: 26). After labouring in the temple for his entire life, Simeon was rewarded with the gift of beholding Christ with his own eyes.

The reward of Simeon is the reward awaiting all of Christ's faithful stewards. The reward of beholding Him with utter joy and peace in Heaven. The USCCB write in their Pastoral Letter on Stewardship, "What is the reward to which good stewards can look forward? The answer is perfect fulfillment in God's Kingdom." It is in God's Kingdom that we will enjoy the beatific vision for all eternity.

So when the commitment to our life of stewardship becomes difficult and we're tempted to despair, let us remember the reward of Simeon that awaits the faithful steward. This remembrance should help us increase our labours of love for God and the Church for we know that we are not doing it for any other purpose than unity with God for all eternity. This is the goal of our Christian lives.

Summary

After labouring in the temple for his entire life, Simeon was rewarded with the gift of beholding Christ with his own eyes. The reward of Simeon is the reward awaiting all of Christ's faithful stewards. So when the commitment to our life of stewardship becomes difficult and we're tempted to despair, let us remember the reward that awaits us of beholding Him with utter joy and peace in Heaven.

As part of Marriage Sunday 2025 celebrations, Bishop Ivan Camilleri will preside at a special Mass to honour married couples, with special recognition for those celebrating 25th, 40th, 50th, 60th and 60+ wedding anniversaries in 2025. The Mass will take place at 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, February 9, 2025 at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica (65 Bond Street, **Toronto).** All married couples will have an opportunity to renew their marriage commitment. All are welcome to attend. Couples celebrating a 25th, 40th, 50th, 60th or 60+ anniversary in 2025 may register for reserved seating. All other seating is on a firstcome, first-served basis. Those who are unable to attend at the Cathedral are invited to join the celebration via livestream Mass. The broadcast will begin at 2:15 p.m.
