"When we were safely ashore, we learned that we were on the island of Malta". - Acts 28:1

SPECIAL READINGS FOR THE FEAST OF ST. PAUL

First Reading: Wisdom 14:5-6

"For even in times of wrath, people escaped from your hands to a place of safety. You guided Noah, whom you loved, on a boat that carried the hope of the world to the new generation."

Commentary: This reading from the Book of Wisdom highlights God's providential care and protection. It reminds us of how Noah and his family were saved from the deluge, symbolizing how God guides and protects His people through the storms of life. In the context of St. Paul's shipwreck on Malta, it emphasizes that despite the perilous journey, God's hand was at work, ensuring the survival and safe arrival of Paul and his companions. This reading invites us to reflect on how God's providence has guided and protected us in our own lives, just as He did for Noah and Paul.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 106 (107): 23-32

"Those who go down to the sea in ships, who do business on great waters, they see the works of the Lord and his wonders in the deep. For he commands and raises the stormy wind, which lifts up the waves of the sea. They mount up to the heavens, they go down again to the depths; their soul melts because of trouble. They reel to and fro and stagger like a drunken man and are at their wits' end. Then they cry out to the Lord in their trouble, and he brings them out of their distresses. He calms the storm, so that its waves are still. Then they are glad because they are quiet; so he guides them to their desired haven."

Commentary: This psalm speaks of the perils faced by sailors and how God's providence calms the storms and brings them to safety. It parallels St. Paul's journey by sea, illustrating the dangers he encountered and how God's providence ensured his survival. As we celebrate the feast of St. Paul, this psalm encourages us to trust in God's care and to recognize His presence in the midst of our own life's storms. It invites us to cry out to the Lord in times of trouble and to trust that He will guide us to safety.

Second Reading: Acts 27:18-25

"For many days neither sun nor stars appeared, and the great storm continued raging. We finally gave up all hope of being saved. After they had gone a long time without food, Paul stood up before them and said: 'Men, you should have taken my advice not to sail from Crete; then you would have spared yourselves this damage and loss. But now I urge you to keep up your courage, because not one of you will be lost; only the ship will be destroyed. Last night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve stood beside me and said, 'Do not be afraid, Paul. You must stand trial before Caesar; and God has graciously given you the lives of all who sail with you.' So keep up your courage, men, for I have faith in God that it will happen just as he told me."

Commentary: This passage from Acts recounts the harrowing experience of Paul and his companions during a violent storm at sea. Despite the fear and hopelessness, Paul remains calm and reassures everyone on board, trusting in God's promise of protection. This reading highlights Paul's unwavering faith in God's providence and serves as a powerful reminder that, even in the most dire circumstances, we can find courage and hope by trusting in God's plan. As we celebrate the feast of St. Paul, we are inspired to cultivate a similar faith and trust in God's guidance.

Gospel Reading: Mark 16:14-18

"Later Jesus appeared to the Eleven as they were eating; he rebuked them for their lack of faith and their stubborn refusal to believe those who had seen him after he had risen. He said to them, 'Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned. And these signs will accompany those who believe: In my name they will drive out demons; they will speak in new tongues; they will pick up snakes with their hands; and when they drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all; they will place their hands on sick people, and they will get well."

Commentary: In this Gospel reading, Jesus rebukes His disciples for their lack of faith and then commissions them to spread the Gospel to all nations. This passage underscores the importance

of faith and the responsibility of believers to share the Good News. In the context of St. Paul's shipwreck and his subsequent ministry in Malta, it reminds us of the transformative power of faith and the call to evangelize. As we celebrate this feast, we are encouraged to strengthen our faith and to be active witnesses of Christ's love and message in our own lives.

Conclusion

The readings for the feast of St. Paul's shipwreck to Malta emphasize Divine Providence and the importance of faith and trust in God's protection. They invite us to reflect on our own experiences of God's guidance and care, and to celebrate the legacy of St. Paul, whose unwavering faith and dedication to spreading the Gospel continue to inspire us. May these readings help us to deepen our faith and to trust in God's providence in all circumstances.
