When I was young, my parents took my siblings and me in a road trip around Lake Superior. I remember being amazed at the lake's various shores, especially the Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore in Michigan that the waves, over time, had shaped into picturesque rock formations.

Today's Gospel speaks of the perseverance in prayer. As I was reflecting on Jesus' words, the image of the waves sculpting the lakeshore came to mind and I was reminded of the power of steadfast prayer.



Because prayer is a means by which we grow in relationship with God, prayer is surely transformative. We may not see it immediately, but the Lord is constantly working in our lives. Our prayers, just like every wave, have an effect. They can transform fear into courage, weakness into strength, uncertainty into confidence, loneliness into friendship. There is no intention too small or too great for our Lord. He longs for us to come to him and meet him in prayer.
