
We are called to be humble. Easier said than done! What does that even mean? The answer lies in understanding ourselves in relationship with our merciful God.

Humility and gratitude are interconnected. Being grateful is to see everything as gift. Unlike a payment or a reward, a gift is undeserved. To understand that we have not earned, nor are we entitled to, anything we are given, is humility.

Etiquette dictates that we demonstrate appreciation in order to receive a gift well. Integrity dictates that we are interiorly moved through humility to gratitude and its expression. Our faith calls us to receive God's gifts, including every breath we draw in, with a deepening humility. We, ourselves, are a gift from God and the only gift we have to return is gratitude. It's not a trade, but a transformation of the heart when we understand who we are. Nothing we could present would earn God's mercy.

Humility can be difficult to understand or accept until it is seen through the lens of a grateful heart. Becoming aware that we fall short in our response to the love of God can also lead to see how we are being loved unconditionally.
