# Sunday Reflection... written by Beth Porter

Many People who have lost a loved one may say that they hope to see them again one day. In today's Gospel we meet some Sadducees, a group who did not believe in life after death. They describe an unlikely but possible situation in order to challenge Jesus' teaching about the resurrection, trying to make it appear foolish.

The custom of arguing view-points so as to get the meaning of biblical texts was and still is part of Jewish education. Jesus, who would have studied in his local synagogue as a boy, was adept as such disputation. Jesus takes the opportunity to engage with the Sadducees and clarify for all present (and for us) the spiritual nature of life after death. As further proof, Jesus quotes Scripture: God is (not was) the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

Often a loved person who has passed on may remain very real to us. Yet sometimes we can clutter up our minds with questions and doubts because, like the Sadducees, we start with an incorrect premise. Jesus calls us to think in spiritual terms. My friend Michael, who has an intellectual disability, has a simple faith. He will look up at the sky and talk to his deceased brother Adam or his friend Father Henri as though they are right here. "Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive."
