



December 25, 2022 Nativity of our Lord - Year A

Sunday Reflection... written by Teresa Whalen Lux

Think about some traditional depictions of the Nativity: Mary gazing adoringly at her baby who lies in a pristine manger; Joseph serenely standing guard; the stable animals keeping a respectful distance. Hmmm. Somehow I doubt the first Christmas looked much like that. Mary especially would have been exhausted from the long trek to Bethlehem, the fruitless search for lodging and the anxious hours of labour in a cold, dark cave. Finally, after giving birth, she placed the newborn in a food trough, surrounded by smelly, noisy animals. Not quite the same picture, is it?

But what a great image to help us ponder the mystery of the Incarnation! John's Gospel tells us that in the birth of Jesus, we have seen God's glory. What the Nativity story shows us is that it's not in majesty and perfection that we see the glory of God, but in the chaos of the ordinary human life.

God doesn't wait for the perfect conditions to come to us. Rather, God is with us now in the messiest and darkest of situations: broken relationships, financial hardships, family tensions, grief over lost loved ones. At Christmas, we celebrate the God who comes to us as a light in our darkness. Our hearts filled with gratitude, we welcome that light into our lives today.
