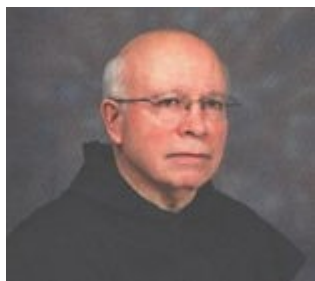

Fr. Dominic Borg was born in Malta in 1947 and is a member of disalced Carmelite Friars. At fourteen years and six months, he became a Postulant of the Disalced Carmelite Order and began the Novitiate at fifteen. After the Novitiate, he was sent to Oxford, England, to study philosophy. After finishing philosophy, he studied theology at the National Institute of Ecclesiastical Studies for Religious in Malta ("INSERM"). He was ordained a Carmelite priest in 1972.

He has an in-depth knowledge and expertise in the Biblical languages of Hebrew and Greek. While still a student of theology, he was asked by his biblical professors to join the Maltese Bible Society in their translation of the Bible from the original languages to Maltese. Having been granted permission by his Superiors, he was assigned the Book of Psalms.

He was a former member of the Malta Bible Society, British and Foreign Bible Society and United Bible Societies.

Besides speaking on Biblical topics both to religious and secular audiences, he also held roles, including Superior of Religious Communities, Master of Formation for Students and Provincial Councilor.
